<sup>\*</sup>In an enteric outbreak, if the toilet used by the ill resident is shared with other residents, the bathroom area should be cleaned and disinfected after each use by the ill resident.

## Please follow the directions below:

- <u>Prior</u> to entering room, perform hand hygiene and wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) as posted on resident's door. Discard PPE appropriately <u>before</u> leaving the room and perform hand hygiene
- Items and surfaces should be cleaned first and then disinfected
- Work from cleanest areas to the dirtiest areas of the room
- Use a general virucide disinfectant with a claim against non-enveloped viruses:
  - o Ensure cleaning cloths are fully saturated prior to disinfecting surfaces
  - Use bucket and rag system (do not spray disinfectant solution onto surfaces)
  - Only dip cleaning cloths into disinfectant solution once
  - o Change cleaning cloths frequently (never use a cloth in more than one room)
