Project Update



The new building will be welcoming, inclusive and supportive – a safe space for men experiencing or at risk of homelessness to access vital supports. More than just a place to stay, the program will help people make connections to services increase life stability while they work towards finding permanent housing in the broader community.

Construction can begin once all planning applications are approved by the Town of Aurora and after completion of the Henderson Sewage Pumping Station. Construction of the pumping station is progressing well and expected to wrap up in 2023.

York Region is proposing 37 emergency housing beds and 31 transitional housing beds. The Town of Aurora recently provided comments on the Zoning By-Law Amendment Application submitted by the Region. The project team continues to work closely with the Town and the Community Liaison Committee to address the comments and prepare the next set of drawings. The Town of Aurora is planning a public meeting in early 2023.

The new year ahead presents many opportunities to build on the progress made so far. We will continue to keep the community informed throughout all stages of the project. Visit **york.ca/MensHousing** for project updates and answers to frequently asked questions.



Other Emergency and Transitional Housing Developments

The need for emergency and transitional housing remains high in our communities, and many individuals and families struggle to find safe and affordable housing.

To help people keep and find housing, York Region recently opened Passage House, an 18-unit transitional housing building for adult men in the Town of East Gwillimbury.
