YORK REGION GROWTH CONTEXT

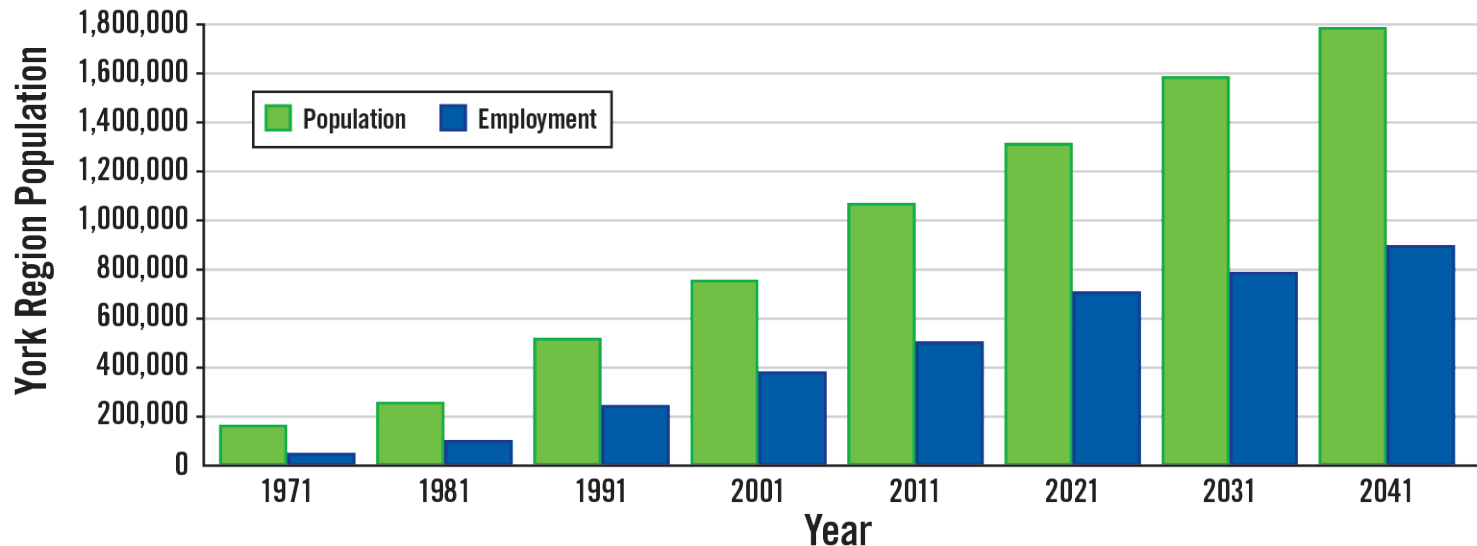
York Region's **population** is expected to grow from

1.1 MILLION in 2016 to **1.8** MILLION in 2041

York Region's **employment** is expected to grow from

595 THOUSAND in 2016 to **900** THOUSAND in 2041

York Region Population Growth - 1971 to 2041

- Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan

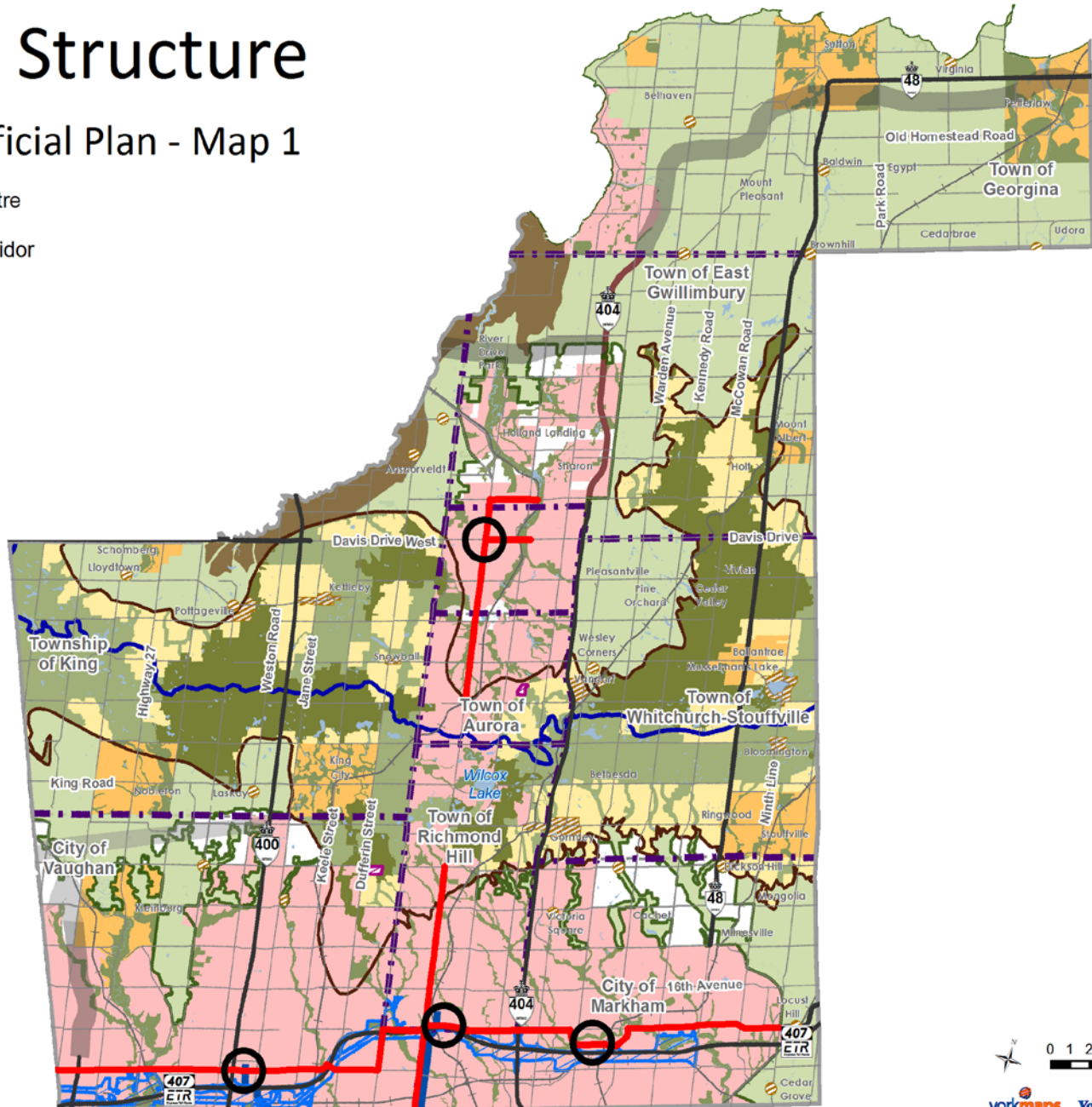


Planning **decisions** need to **conform** to Provincial Plans

-  Regional Corridor

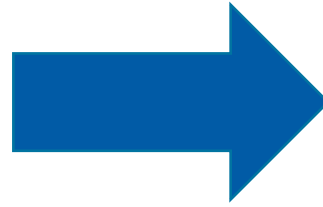

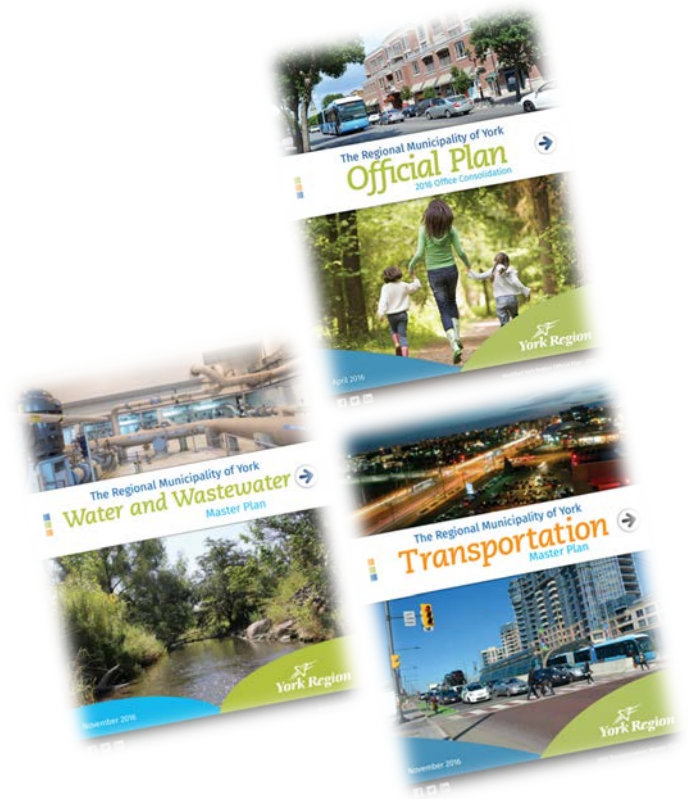

- Consultation builds on previous input and feedback

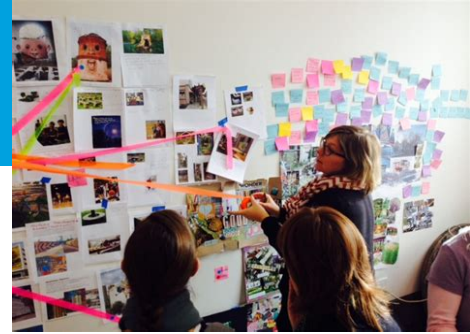

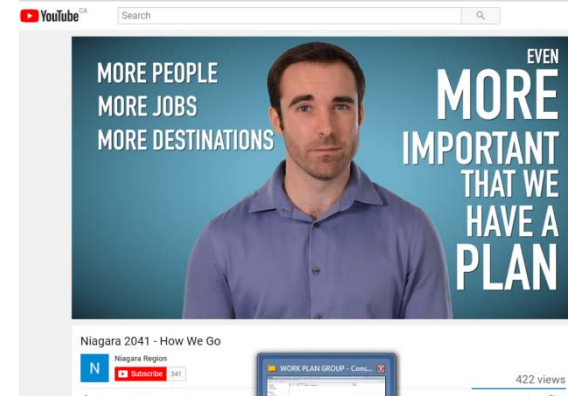

- Draft Regional Official Plan and Vision

PHASE 5 – Q2 2020

- Adoption of Regional Official Plan and final Vision
