Fees and Charges – School Boards are dedicating space at no cost to program, Local Municipalities are delivering program, York Region is supporting coordination. (Quantity of Effort) High effort of the Working Group: approved criteria and pilot sites, agreed on fees and charges, began program development and finalizing Memorandum of Understanding.</p> <p>How well did we do? (Quality of Effort) Monthly working group meetings bringing the core stakeholders together to collaboratively plan and move forward focusing on the 5 key areas mentioned – implementation date is September 2014</p> <p>Is anyone better off? (Quantity and Quality of Effect) Low to Moderate Income families will have access to recreation for their children in grade 6-8 in their neighbourhood. Municipalities, school boards and York Region have maximized resources and expertise to create a program suited to the needs of each neighbourhood</p> <p>Tell us how the Fair Access Partnership Pilot Program can support the work of the Board.
